Workshop Overview:

COVID-19 has demonstrated the profound effects it has placed on healthcare. It has played havoc on patients, residents, staff, and families. In addition, it has stressed employers, society, and caused an increase in behavioral/mental health issues. This workshop identifies the physical, behavioral/mental health, and emotional consequences of individuals experiencing a "Critical Incident" and/or long-term exposure to chronic stress. This workshop is designed to define the types of critical stress, the warning signs, and symptoms and provide examples of Critical Incident Stress Management Policies/Procedures. In addition, the workshop will identify intervention strategies as well as comprehensive recovery resources to help those affected.
